* Section Meeting Draws ~143

Valentine's Day brought two special events together in the same area: the World Ag Expo, also known as the Tulare Farm Show, and the California-Nevada Section meeting that included a keynote speech by California Secretary of Food and Agriculture, A. G. Kawamura.

The Section meeting was held at the Edison AgTAC Center in Tulare, Calif., directly across the street from the World Ag Expo. A western corral barbecue dinner awaited the 143 meeting participants. In attendance was ASABE President Charles Sukup, who had the opportunity earlier to attend his first World Ag Expo (www.worldagexpo.com). Historic Landmark dedication videos brought by President Sukup and a slideshow of Section information were presented during the reception and dinner.

After the obligatory business items, the meeting continued with updates given by the five schools in attendance: Butte College, Cal Poly. San Luis Obispo, California State University (CSU) Fresno, Modesto Junior College, and the University of California (UC) Davis. Expect to see more detailed reports in forthcoming editions of the Update. New officers Ginger L-Heureux, Membership Chair, and Traeger Cotten, Industry/Student Liason, were welcomed to the leadership team.

Attending for the very first time, the relatively new Modesto Junior College Student Mechanization Branch's 1/4-Scale Tractor Team, advised by member engineer Steve Amador, gave a report of their successes over the past two years. The Cal Poly 1/4-Scale Tractor Team followed with their report and a presentation of plaques of appreciation to last year's sponsors, AIM and the Section. The Section pledged \$500 to each team to support their activities.

Past Section Chair Jim Usher got the surprise of the evening when he received the Section Engineer of the Year Award for his work with Bently Agrowdynamics and his contributions to the Section. Not only an exemplary engineer for his company, Jim gave an enlightening talk on biodiesel at last year's meeting and is an integral part of the Section's fundraising activities.

Deborah Hamblin of the Irrigation Association spoke enthusiastically on both her appreciation of and the further need for agricultural engineers in the challenge of managing the limited western water supply. ASABE President Charles Sukup discussed the Centennial and the Society's past, present, and future.

California Secretary of Food and Agriculture, A. G. Kawamura, gave a compelling keynote speech regarding food safety, bioterrorism, water supply, California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger's agricultural childhood, conservation, and the environment.

* Cal Poly mourns Professor John Merriam

On February 9th, 2007, John L. Merriam passed away. Merriam was a professor emeritus in the BioResources and Agricultural Engineering Department in Cal Poly's College of Agriculture, from which he retired in 1978. He was inducted as an ASABE Fellow in 2005.

For more than 60 years, Merriam had been involved in irrigation and water management issues as a researcher, educator, consultant, and philanthropic program contributor in the U.S. and abroad. His work took him to Sri Lanka, India, Pakistan, Egypt and China. His work earned two patents in irrigation technology.

During his career, Merriam received other honors including the Conservationist of the Year award from the Soil Conservation Society of America, Man of the Year from the California Irrigation Institute and the Kishida International Award from ASABE.
