#### Improving Energy Efficiency in Drip Irrigation Class at AgTAC, February 11, 2009

The morning before the CA/NV Meeting, Stuart Styles will be teaching a free class titled "Improving Energy Efficiency in Drip Irrigation" from 9am to 12pm at the AgTAC facility. This popular class focuses on drip irrigation operation and its effect on overall energy use. The recently updated Cal Poly ITRC Drip and Micro Irrigation book will be utilized to target specific improvements that can lower on-farm energy requirements. The class will tie together critical topics including distribution uniformity, pump efficiency, irrigation scheduling, and utilizing time-of-use schedules. The class will break down the components that are involved in the calculation of the annual energy cost. Recommendations will be made on specific cases where growers can impact their overall energy use.
