Additionally, PEI and ASABE have partnered to provide an incentive to candidates by reimbursing October 2011 Agricultural PE exam registration fees up to \$300 on a first-come, first-served basis. Candidates must be first-time Agricultural PE test takers who have not attempted to take a PE exam in any discipline prior to the respective administration, must pay all up-front costs for the application and administration of the exam, and must request reimbursement for state application fees and NCEES test administration costs not exceeding \$300 upon receiving a letter from one's respective state board of licensure with the results of the exam.
