We have truckloads of our regular (50 lb) bales of WoodStraw[®] available for immediate shipment to fireline and burned property erosion control rehab on fires in California. CalFire has numerous bulldozers working the Robbers and Highway 16 fires, so there is inevitably a lot of sediment risk from private properties to the American River and Cache Creek.

Our large bale line was running flat out in late July building bales for helimulching in Colorado, but our small bale line has capacity for regional orders. However, if there will be helimulching on the Robbers, Mill, or other fires in California, we can reserve a production slot for your fires.
