CDFM Farm Visits Underway!

The California Farm Demonstration Network (CFDN) is hosting a series of farm visits for agricultural producers during the months of May and June that will demonstrate how long-term goals for healthy soil are being achieved at each farm—without compromising production. Farmers using various soil health practices (such as cover crops, conservation tillage and more) will discuss their soil health management systems and experiences. Network partners, including representatives from the Natural Resources Conservation Service, UC Cooperative Extension, Resource Conservation Districts and other partners will also be on hand to explain monitoring and evaluation work being done on the farms. Fresno State officials and donors broke ground on April 13, 2014 for the \$24-million Jordan Research Center to serve as a hub of collaboration to solve agricultural challenges. The 30,000 square-foot facility will feature wet and dry labs, lab support space and meeting areas in which students can study as well as collaborate on research projects.

Fresno State President Dr. Joseph Castro and other university officials will open the Jordan Agricultural Research Center with a ribbon cutting ceremony on the corner of Woodrow and Barstow Avenue on May 13, 2016. ❖ Career Development – Mock Interviews! - Article by Your Career Development Chair, Josh Peppers You probably wouldn't walk into an important exam without preparing in advance. For those who took the EIT/FE exam, you probably remember all the nights you spent reviewing course notes and exam prep materials. On test day, you were calm, confident, and relaxed because you had prepared! Well, job interviewing should be no different. Who wants to blow a great job opportunity by not having a polished presentation of themselves? Because interviewing is not natural for most people, going through a mock interview is a great way to hone your self-selling skills to a potential employer.

For those who are still in school, your local university should have practice interviews available at its career center. For alumni, contact your alma mater to see if they offer this service for you too. Before going into a mock interview, you should take time to evaluate 1) why this job is a good fit for you 2) your overall career goals 3) what skills you bring to the employer 4) what sets you apart from the other candidates. Thinking these things though ahead of time will help you deliver a fluid, cohesive response that will make you look good. Employers often ask for succinct stories that illustrate your skills so have some of these ready as well. You should also research the employer ahead of time so you can ask intelligent questions to the interviewer and show that you really are interested in the company. Doing these things as an exercise in a mock interview will give you the foundation and experience to "knock 'em dead" during the real thing.
